

Dundee Elementary Academy Re-Opening Overview

In an effort to aid your family in choosing academic options for the upcoming school year, information is provided regarding our school reopening, in accordance with Polk County Public Schools. Please continue to frequently check emails, school website and facebook page for school specific information as it is updated frequently.

- Please visit the link to complete one intent form needs to be completed for EACH student; parents will need their student's ID#; this can be found on Parent Portal, under the Child Info page, directly under the student's name.
- The deadline to complete the intent form is **Sunday, August 2nd at 11:59pm**
- Families who have not responded to the form by the deadline will move forward with plans for their student to participate in Campus Learning.
- Students who are not registered will **not** have transportation arrangements at the start of the 2020-21 school year.
- Families who choose to return to face to face classes or our campus eSchool and decide to change your mind, you will be able to switch your choice by calling DEA with your intent. We ask that you do try and commit to one form of learning for the grading period (9 weeks) to help the school with school/teacher assignments.
- Families who select Polk Virtual school will be withdrawn from DEA and enrolled at that school, there is not an option to return to DEA this year. Families will have to reapply during the open enrollment period for the 2021-2022 school year.
- All learning options include State Testing.

Campus eSchool

Campus eSchool serves as a bridge between DEA and a purely digital environment. Students will remain enrolled at DEA, but learning will take place from the safety of your own home.

Enrollment	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Campus eSchool allows your child to remain enrolled at DEA Academy.● Students can return to their campuses second, third or fourth quarter if they choose.
Participation	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Our goal is to provide a high-quality, interactive educational experience for all students. Through the eSchool model, students will still experience the International Baccalaureate (IB) education. Our program encourages both personal and academic achievement,

	<p>challenging students to excel in their studies and in their personal development.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Structured class times will mirror our traditional school day, with required participation in live and recorded lessons. School days will be highly structured, with specific times for students to log on and take part in lessons and activities. • Student log-on times will ensure students have the opportunity to communicate with their peers and teachers. Teachers will offer video conferencing instructional opportunities. • Campus eSchool hours will be the same as our brick-and-mortar school hours. Students are required to be logged on to eSchool from 8:15 am until 3:15 pm.
Technology	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An electronic device is needed (minimum iPad or laptop, Mac computers are compatible) • Polk County Public Schools is loaning district student laptops for students who need the appropriate technology. Laptops will be distributed by DEA. Please indicate your need on the Student Intent Registration Form.
Individual Needs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students with IEPs, 504 plans, EPs, ELL plans, etc., will continue to have their individual needs met via virtual supports in the Campus eSchool. • Related services such as Occupational Therapy (OT), Physical Therapy (PT), Speech Language Therapy (SLP) support will be modified to fit the Campus eSchool model while ensuring the safety of students and staff members.
Supplies	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Our supply list has been modified and posted on our website.

Campus Learning

Face Coverings	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cloth face coverings are required for all students K-12 and recommended for PreK as well. These must be appropriate for school. • Face coverings will be available for students in need, limited supply. • All bus riders are required to wear a cloth face covering. • Face coverings are most essential in times when physical distancing is difficult. • If there is a medical reason for someone not to wear a mask, there must be documentation submitted from a physician and will be a case by case basis.
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<p>Social Distancing</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● In the classroom we will be adhering to social distancing as feasible, when possible. For example, all students facing the same direction. ● Regular specials schedule will include Art, Music, and PE and CDC/PCPS guidelines will be followed. ● Students will not be allowed to share supplies and will be required to use their own supplies that they store in their backpacks. ● Walking patterns around campus have been established to allow one-way travel and for social distancing reasons.
<p>Arrival/ Dismissal</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Parents are required to screen their child for temperature and symptoms prior to coming to school. ● Daily pre-screening per district expectations will be in place for all students and staff. 20% of the students will have temperature screenings throughout the day, as required by the district office so that everyone has their temperature taken weekly. ● Parents will not be allowed to be on campus for drop off/pick up, breakfast or lunches.
<p>Campus Circulation</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Sanitizing stations will be placed throughout the school for student's frequent use. ● Walking patterns have been established to allow one-way travel and for social distancing reasons.
<p>School Nutrition</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Cafeteria seating is modified to encourage social distancing (rows, facing the same direction) ● Hand sanitizing stations will be present ● Outdoor and classroom dining will be utilized when feasible
<p>Cleaning</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Routine environmental cleaning and disinfecting of high-touch areas with an EPA approved disinfectant for SARS-CoV-2 will be completed during high-density times. ● Deep cleaning in response to a confirmed or suspected case will occur per CDC and the Florida Department of Education guidelines. <div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-between; margin-top: 20px;"> <div style="width: 45%;"> <p>DAILY</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Put on gloves and other required PPE and place Caution Floor Sign at entrance - Sweep up large debris from the floor with lobby broom and dust pan and place in trash container. - Empty trash and disinfect trash container with disinfecting wipes. Replace liner. - Wipe all surfaces and high touch objects with Disinfecting Wipes. - Clean spots or visible dirt on floors with a back-pack vac/vacuum/microfiber floor pad - Inspect the space <p>HIGH TOUCH SURFACES</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Increase frequency of wiping down high touch surfaces/objects with Disinfecting – 2 additional times per day providing there is additional staff </div> <div style="width: 45%;"> <p>WEEKLY</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Put on gloves and other required PPE and place Caution Floor Sign at entrance - Sweep up large debris from the floor with lobby broom and dust pan and place in trash container. - Empty trash and disinfect trash container with Disinfecting Wipes. Replace liner. - Fully clean surfaces and high touch objects with Disinfecting Wipes. - Fully clean floors (vacuum or microfiber floor pad with EPA Registered Disinfectant - Inspect the space </div> </div>
